



## Protecting our Community: COVID-19

### Distancing Guidelines

Satori will follow and enforce social distancing protocols:

- Only students and adult Satori staff will be admitted into classrooms and school buildings beyond the offices.
- Everyone entering a building must:
  - wear a mask.
  - wash their hands before entering.
  - maintain a physical distance of 3 ft. when possible.
- No one presenting with COVID-19-like symptoms will be permitted on campus, including the parking lot outside of a car, and the playground.
- Adults on campus will wear face coverings and maintain a 3 ft. distance from other adults on campus while indoors.
- Classroom spaces will be organized:
  - with 3 ft. distance between seated individuals.
  - to maintain a comfortable environment that promotes safety and community.

Seating and workspaces will encourage healthful distancing, including the use of assigned seating, desks and workspaces spaced 3 ft. apart, etc.

### Face Masks

- Satori will work with students aged five and older to assist them in wearing face coverings while on campus.
- All adults will wear face coverings while indoors.
- Face coverings must cover the nose and mouth. Satori is encouraging medical grade paper masks, KN95, or N95 style masks
- Face coverings may be removed for eating or other activities provided a 6 ft. distance is maintained from others and when outdoors.
  - Indoor mask breaks should be during quiet times.
  - No talking, singing, or shouting when mask is off.
  - Mask breaks are safest:
    - outdoors.

- in other areas with enough outdoor air.
  - Mask breaks should be no more than 5 minutes indoors.
  - A minimum distance of 6 ft. must be maintained between unmasked individuals.

- Extra precautions, including distancing, will be exercised for those individuals who are not wearing masks.

### Hand Washing

- Everyone must wash their hands or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer before entering any Satori building.
- Hand washing stations and/or alcohol-based hand sanitizer will be available outside of each building.
- Each classroom will incorporate a handwashing protocol into their daily routines.
- Hand washing stations and/or alcohol-based hand sanitizer will be available in each classroom.
- Alcohol-based sanitizer will not be available in the preschool classroom or in Extended Care due to licensing restrictions, but frequent hand washing routines will be incorporated into the daily schedule.

### Flow Patterns in the Buildings

- Everyone must follow the posted flow pattern protocol between the hours of 8:00 AM and 3:30 PM.
- Flow patterns will be established in each building and clearly marked with directional signage.
- Thorough cleaning and disinfecting will occur throughout the day.

### Air Flow

- Satori maintains air flow in the buildings throughout the day.
- Portable air cleaners and room humidifiers may be used to increase air flow.

### Cleaning Protocols

Cleaning and disinfecting of high use surfaces with disinfecting chemicals will occur throughout the day.

- Surfaces such as classroom, bathroom and exterior doors, gates, tables,

desktops will be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected according to CDC guidelines.

- Frequently touched surfaces and shared objects in classrooms and common areas will be wiped down at a minimum of every 24 hours using approved products.
- Desktops and workspaces will be disinfected after used on a regular daily schedule.

## Illness Policy

In accordance with Pima County Health Department:

### **For Students 5-year-olds through 8<sup>th</sup> grade**

If a child **tests positive** for COVID -19:

- Student must stay home and isolate for 5 days--this is regardless of vaccination status. Day of positive test or 1<sup>st</sup> symptoms is day 0
- Student may return to school on day 6 with a non-cloth mask, they have been fever-free for 24 hours without medication, and any other symptoms are improving or resolved.

If a child has been **in contact** with someone who is COVID-19 positive and is **vaccinated** (more than 2 weeks after second vaccine):

- Student may come to school and stay masked with non-cloth mask.
- Student must stay home if any symptoms appear and test.
- Student must test on day 5 (do not test before this if there are no symptoms). Day of last contact is day 0.

If a child has been **in contact** with someone who is COVID -19 positive and is **NOT vaccinated** (or it has been less than 2 weeks since second vaccine):

- Student must stay home for 5 days and test on 5<sup>th</sup> day. Last day of exposure is Day 0
- Student may return to school on day 6 with a non-cloth mask if they have no symptoms.
- If any symptoms appear, students must stay home and test.

### **For students ages 2 ½ through 4**

If a child **tests positive** for COVID-19: Stay home (isolate) for **10 days**

- Day of positive test is considered day 0
- Child may return to school after day 10 if they have been fever-free for 24 hours without medication and any other symptoms are improving or resolved.

If a child **is exposed** to someone who tested positive to COVID-19: Stay home and quarantine for **10 days**

- Child may test on or after days 5-7 post-exposure
- If test result is negative, child may return to school on day 8
- If the child is too young to test, or tests are unavailable, stay home for the full 10- day quarantine.

*\*Close contact: within 6 ft. of someone who has COVID-19 for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.*

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
